- Automated tools will do the grunt work
- A human will make the final decision!
- No system has passed the Turing Test (circa1950) yet, maybe by 2029

Cyber Crime



- The problem is big!
- We don't know how big since stats are not accurate
 - Interpol: \$8 Billion USD/year
 - Transnational problem
- We are seeing trends

- Single actor being replaced by:
 - Organized criminals
 - Criminal organizations
 - Terrorists

- Criminal Organization
 - Relationship of convenience
- Organized Crime
 - Traditional "mafia" type syndicates
- Terrorists
 - FARC, Al-Qaeda, Taliban

- Targets shifting
 - Individuals to Banks
 - Banks to multinational corps
 - Large scale frauds
 - Corp blackmail




Conclusions
